

Jesus meets us ...

... where we are

1. The woman at the well in Samaria (John 4:1-42)

- Lonely and excluded because of her lifestyle

Maybe you don't know much about Jesus and don't yet realise you need a Saviour – Jesus can meet you right where you are.

2. The rich young man (Mark 10:17-22)

- Religious, fervent, a 'good person'

Has Jesus met with us to challenge our priorities and we have not yet obeyed?

3. Martha of Bethany (Luke 10:38-42; John 11:5; 27)

- Loving friend who wanted to please Jesus

*Do some of us need to meet Jesus
afresh in the midst of our busyness
and activity?*

4. The disciples on the Road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35)

- Disappointed, disillusioned, confused

There are times in our Christian walk when we can become disappointed and disillusioned – maybe we don't get the answers to prayer we want, or maybe other Christians, family, or friends let us down. Jesus knows and wants to meet with us and restore our hope.

5. Peter on the rooftop (Acts 9:32 to 10:1-48)

- Key leader, preacher and miracle worker

Just when we think we are doing OK, we are walking in His ways, we are blessed and enjoying Jesus, are we ready for Him to meet with us and to open up new horizons?

Wherever we are in our walk with Jesus
are we ready to meet with Him? If we are,
He won't leave us where we are but will
take us on into new things.

*Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it
springs forth, do you not perceive it?*
