Origins of Tithing in the Bible

Genesis 14:19-20

19 and he blessed Abram, saying, “Blessed be Abram by God Most High, Creator of heaven and earth.

20 And praise be to God Most High, who delivered your enemies into your hand.” Then Abram gave him a tenth of everything.

Tithing in the Law of Moses

Leviticus 27:30:

“A tithe of everything from the land, whether grain from the soil or fruit from the trees, belongs to the LORD; it is holy to the LORD.”

Numbers 18:23-24

“The Levites are to perform the work of the tent of meeting, and they will bear the responsibility for offenses against it. This is a lasting ordinance for the generations to come. They will receive no inheritance among the Israelites. Instead, I give to the Levites as their inheritance the tithes that the Israelites present as an offering to the LORD...”

Deuteronomy 14:22-23

“be sure to set aside a tenth of all that your fields produce each year... so that you may learn to revere the LORD your God always.”

Tithing in the New Testament

Matthew 23:23

"Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You give a tenth of your spices--mint, dill and cumin. But you have neglected the more important matters of the law--justice, mercy and faithfulness. You should have practiced the latter, without neglecting the former.

2 Corinthians 9:6-7
